
## THE MATTER IN OF RICHARD WATTS'S CHARINY In the City of Rochester.



## NUDDID

All Nurses appointed under the Scheme for the Administration of this Charity must be women of good character and health and otherwise competent to efficiently discharge the duties to be assigned to them. Before appointing any woman as Nurse the Trustees will require the production of a Certificate of competency to perform the duties of Nurse from some duly qualified Medical Man.

The duties of the Nurses will be under the direction of the Head Nurse to attend the Almspeople in sickness and to visit or attend at their own residences poor deserving persons afflicted with illness whether of a temporary or permanent character and poor deserving married women intheir confinement resident within the City of Rochester or the limits liberties or Precincts thereof.

All applications for the appointment must be made in writing to the Trustees, or their Clerk, at No. 33, High Street, Rochester (where further particulars and forms of application may be obtained) on or before Saturday, the 2nd day of June, 1888. Every Applicant must state her name, age, occupation, place of residence, state of health and condition in life, and must be prepared with sufficient Certificates and Testimonials and other evidence of her qualification for the appointment.
