QUARTERLY REPORT. Jan- March.

On March 31st. there were 91 cases on the books. From January 1st to March 31st. 128 new cases were attended, an increase of 13 on the corresponding period last year. The Trained Nurses have made 4,313 visits compared with 3,692 during the same period last year.

The Assistant Nurses have made 1,547 visits.

From these figures it will be seen that the Nurses have been quite busy, and while each nurse has carried out her duties in a capable and willing manner, I should like to pay tribute to ~~the~~ Nurse Short-house whose interest and energy is outstanding. Nurse Wever is working weel on the District but is not very domesticated, rather a detriment to her household equipment.

A few letters of thanks have been received from grateful patients and some public acknowledgements have appeared in the Press. Miss Brown continues to carry out her many duties in a splendid manner.
