

This Indenture Witnesseth

that Mary Douglas daughter of James Douglas of Rochester hereafter put
 her self Apprenticed to William Andrews of Milton next Gravesend in Kent Taylor
 and with her after the manner of an Apprenticed to serve from
 the day of the date of these presents unto the full end and tenn of
 seven years from thence not ensuing fully to be compleat and ended during
 which tenn the said Apprenticed her sd Master - faithfully shall and will serve
 her sd Master his lawfull Commaund, duty wherof gladly doo. he shall doo no
 Damagge to her sd Master - nor sdd it to be done of others but to her poudre shall
 be or forthwith give notice to her sd Master - of the same The goods of her sd
 Master he shall not waste nor the same without licence of him to any give or lend
 Lend to her sd Master he shall not doo cause or procure to be done, he shall
 neither buy nor sell without her Masters licence, Taverns, Inns, or Alehouses,
 he shall not haunt, at Cards, dice, Table, or any other unlawfull Games. he shall
 not play, - - - - - nor from
 the service of her sd Master - day nor night absent her self but in all things
 as an honest and faithfull Apprenticed shall and will demean & behave her
 self towards her sd Master - and all this during the sd tenn And the said
 Master his sd Apprenticed in the Art mystery or occupation of Needlework & Good
 housewifery - - - which he now useth shall teach and instruct, or cause to be taught
 instructed, the best way and maner that he - can find & allow in his said
 Apperlice sufficient wherof he shall not appear all washing & drying pale
 of apparell for all parts of his body - (that is to say) one for working days
 and the other for holydaies fit for her wearing
 And for the true performanc of all and every the sd Covenant and agreemnt
 within of the sd parties abovesaid bindeth him self unto the other jointly by these
 present In Witnesse wherof the sd parties to these Indentures Interschangably have
 sett their hands and seals, the first phenelith - - day of January - in the
 eight - - year of the Reigne of our Sovereign Lady Anne
 by the grace of God of Great Brittain, France, & Ireland, Queen Defender of the faith
 Anno q. Ind 1709
